

# Improved pedestrian safety on Edgecliff Road, Woollahra

Notification of work | September 2022

The Road Safety Stimulus Program is an investment by the Australian and NSW Governments of more than \$400 million to improve safety and reduce crashes on NSW roads.

## What work are we doing?

Transport for NSW will be carrying out work at the traffic lights on Edgecliff Road outside Reddam House and Holy Cross Primary School to improve safety on this road.

This work involves re-building the kerb on both sides of the road to improve the pedestrian crossing so people can safely cross the road. It will also give students more standing room when waiting at the traffic lights.

We will also be extending the current bus zone to allow more room for buses to pull in and out. As a result of this, the current drop-off/pick-up zone will be moved further west and 3 street car spaces will be

unavailable during school pick-up and drop-off times (7am – 9:30am and 2pm – 4pm Monday to Friday).

This work will involve noisy activities such as jackhammering, saw cutting and heavy vehicle movements as well as concreting, electrical works and traffic control set up.

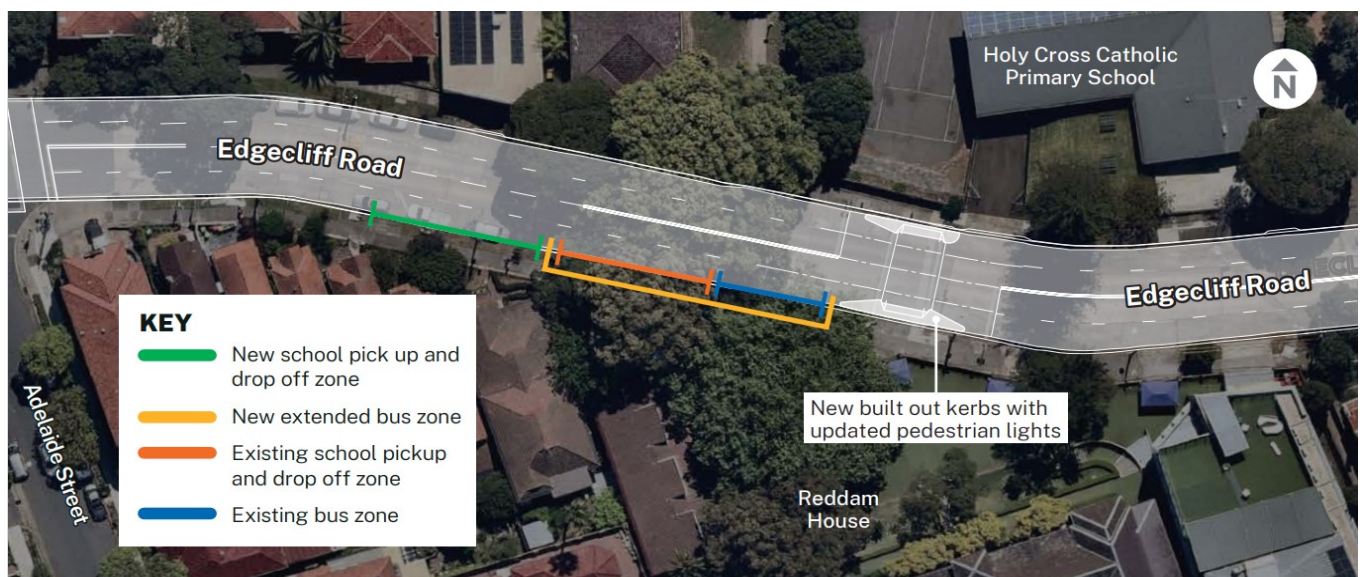
## Our work schedule

We will be on site for up to **20 shifts** from **Monday 26 September to the end of October**, weather permitting.

Our night work hours will be between **8pm and 5am Sunday to Thursday**.

Our day work hours will be between **7am and 6pm Monday to Friday** and **8am to 1pm Saturday**.

We will provide periods of respite in between shifts.

## How will the work affect you?

**The signalised pedestrian crossing will remain in operation throughout the duration of the project.**

Our work will be noisy at times. We will do everything we can to minimise the impact including undertaking some of the noisier works during the day, to reduce the amount of noise at night. When we do need to work at night, we will stop activities such as jackhammering by midnight.

There will be a temporary traffic changes during some of our work hours to ensure the work zone is safe.

Please keep to speed limits and follow signs and traffic controllers' directions.
