A - Objections:

- Poor connectivity to bus and train
- Increased residential development
- High density- Building envelope guidelines changed
- Rezoning from RE2 upward
- Two new 26 storey towers (or more)
- Changed Floor space ratio
- Overshadowing (Trumper park, private dwellings McLean St, Ocean ave)
- Loss of Heritage
- Loss of private amenity: tyre repair, car servicing workshop, petrol station, gyms,
- No sustainability
- Traffic estimated 70,000 cars a day
- Increased traffic volume
- Congestion and increase in parking requirements in adjacent areas

- More open green spaces and spaces for public art
